Message from the Executive Director

Looking back on 2017, the year has definitely been a year of growth and development. BBBSWB has begun to evolve guided by our strategic plan;

Programs: We piloted a corporate mention program in January, had the opportunity to initiate the GO GIRLS! program, and made new partnerships with Actua to host a group summer camp. We also expanded our Full Circle Mentoring program from 4 schools to 11 schools, allowing us to reach 3 times more youth.

Funding: Through the support of the board we were able to initiate a new Fund Development plan that has been instrumental in supporting the growth of our programs.

Accreditation: The program staff revamped, and reorganized BBBSWB's policies, procedures and service deliver protocols to ensure that all of our youth are receiving the best and safest programming possible.

Reputation: Increased marketing and branding in 2017 has allowed BBBSWB to raise visibility and awareness allowing us to reach out to more people in the community.

Volunteers: Without our volunteers we would not be able to grow and develop the way we have in 2017. We have begun to work on a donor database which will help us continue to recognize our volunteers and supporters for all their great work and contributions.

Board: Through the support of the Leadership Wood Buffalo program, we were joined by a group of dedicated individuals, who helped us to implement some much needed frameworks for board development.

2017 has been a monumental year, as BBBSWB continues to ensure that every child who needs a mentor has a mentor!

Community Based Program

The Community Based Program is a mentoring program that matches kids between the ages of 6-18 with a positive adult role model.

The program involves the matches spending at least 2 hours a week together; during this time they can do outside or inside activities, go to the movies or a restaurant, swimming, and other various activities. The Program allows youth to spend time with that one positive adult that can have a tremendous impact on their life. This one positive adult will spend one on one time with them, listen to them and help guide down good path in life by being their mentor, and by being there for them. We have matches that have been matched for a year, and we have some that have been match for 5 years; the outcome of being match with

that one positive adult is life changing, for both the "Little" and the "Big." The experience is amazing, through-out the match they have the opportunity to attend Big and Little events such as, tubing,



cooking, skating, pumpkin carving, movie nights, and the list goes on. The matches are supported by the Community Base Coordinator, and referrals to be a BIG or a LITTLE for the program can be made by absolutely anyone!

In School Mentoring (ISM)

January 2017 saw the second half of the 2016/2017 school year off to a strong start. There were nine matches to kick off the New Year in schools throughout Fort McMurray. Children at Westview Elementary and Father Turcotte were served by both adult and teen volunteers from the community, each having their own unique 1:1 relationship.

Matches met for one hour a week, during school hours, to build their relationships and have fun together. They did things such as play sports in the school gym, read, create impressive art and crafts, and sometimes just talk, all while learning about themselves and one another. Big Brothers Big Sisters of Wood Buffalo is very appreciative of the support from the RMWB's Crime Prevention and Community Safety Grant which funded In-School Mentoring!

Keyano College Social Work Students

Big Brothers Big Sisters of Wood Buffalo was fortunate enough to partner with Keyano College during their Spring term to supervise students in the Social Work program. Mentoring Coordinators enjoyed having two bright students with them to learn about the various programs and their roles. They accompanied staff to schools and meetings, getting accompanied with volunteers and clients in the process, and provided support to the agency as they learned about the Non-Profit sector.

Corporate Mentoring

The year got more exciting in March with the growth of the site-based program as an exciting partnership opened doors to serving youth in a more rural part of Wood Buffalo! Conoco-Phillips and Big Brothers Big Sisters of Wood Buffalo worked to create a unique and fun new corporate mentoring program at the Surmont site, serving junior high aged youth from Father Perrin School (Janvier).

The corporate mentoring program served ten aboriginal youth over a 14 week period (March – June) at Conoco-Phillips regional residency. Ten exceptional corporate volunteers facilitated the group mentoring program, leading the youth through sports, safety presentations, a scavenger hunt and much more. The year ended with a celebration onsite with an outdoor barbecue and the day ended with a highly anticipated incentive draw, providing one youth with a brand new bike!

September 2017 saw the 2017/2018 corporate mentoring program thrived with nine students and nine volunteers, the students from Janvier were thrilled for the start of the program, starting with a tour of the facilities and a Christmas activity day where they were each youth was surprised with Christmas presents with thanks to donations from a caring community partner. We look forward to what 2018 has to bring for these valuable mentoring programs and strive for growth as we continue to search for committed volunteers!

Our Programs







Full Circle Mentoring









The Full Circle Mentoring program which was piloted in 2009 started off providing programming in 3 community based locations. Fast forward 8 years and with the support of funders, Fort McMurray School boards, community leaders and program staff the program has grown to serving over 150 youth in grades 1-6. In 2017 the program grew to 11 program locations. The expansion is set to continue into 2018.

The program is designed to provide meaningful group mentoring experience that strengthens cultural awareness and pride among Indigenous youth in the Wood Buffalo

Region. Each program location follows their academic school calendar. Each session encourages program participants to explore and build and understanding of their culture through creating mentorships in an after- school program setting. The program runs until the end of June with approximately 32 weekly sessions.

School, Westview School, St. Anne

Community School.

Game On! Eat Smart, Play Smart!

Big Brothers Big Sisters Game On Group Mentoring Program provides male youth ages 10 to 14 with the opportunity to learn about physical activity, healthy eating and building self-esteem within a group setting. This program is designed to last for seven weeks and provides male youth with an opportunity to openly discuss current and pressing issues they face to their male mentors. Male Mentors play a key role in motivating male youth, while peer groups also have a significant impact on an adolescent's physical activity behaviour.

Game On is a new group mentoring program BBBSWB will be piloting in the summer of 2018. Like all of the programs within our agency, we are assured Game On will see great growth and success!



Go-Girls! Healthy Bodies, Healthy Minds!

Go-Girls! Healthy Bodies, Healthy Minds Group Mentoring Program is designed to encourage physical activity participation, healthy eating choices, and the development of a positive self-image, among girls between the ages of 10 to 12. Go-Girls! consists of seven to ten 75 minute sessions, led by female staff and volunteer mentors. The program strives to enhance self-confidence, self-esteem and knowledge about healthy lifestylesespecially with regard to physical activity, healthy eating choices and positive self-image.

Go-Girls! is a new mentoring program that was piloted in the Fort McMurray region in September 2017 in partnership with Girls Inc of Northern Alberta. The program started with a group of 9 girls at Walter and Gladys Hill Public School. We have seen great success thus far and we are very excited for the future growth of the Go-Girls! Mentoring Program.

The Go-Girls! Healthy Bodies, Healthy Minds Program is sponsored by the Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo through the Joint Initiatives Grant.









Actua Summer Camp

In August 2017 Big Brothers Big Sisters of Wood Buffalo partnered with Actua to execute a one week Science and Innovation Camp to youth in the Fort McMurray area. The summer camp provided 26 children between the ages of 9 to 12 with the opportunity to learn about science, technology, engineering and math (STEM).

Actua is a national Canadian charity with a mission to provide all youth, regardless of background, ability or socioeconomic status, experiential learning opportunities in STEM. Through hands-on learning youth build confidence in themselves and their ability to do math and science in school.

Throughout the camp, participants learned about chemistry, computer data, circuitry, energy and much more. Participants enjoyed a field trip to Finning Canada's, Fort McKay location where they were given the opportunity to explore the many different types of mining equipment and were given a front row seat to a live car crush!
